JOHN:

I AM TRYING TO FIND SOME OF THE ISSUES YOU ARE MISSING OF THE CUB. IN MY LETTERS TO FORMER MEMBERS OF THE DIVISION I ASK IF THEY HAPPENED TO HAVE OLD ISSUES.

I HAVE A COPY OF THE MAY 5, 1944 ISSUE, ONLY BECAUSE MY PICTURE IS IN IT. I CAN TRUTHFULLY SAY I DON'T REMEMBER THE INTERVIEW.

JOHN, WHEN I ARRIVED IN ENGLAND THE PILOTS & GROUND CREWS REPORTED TO THE GLOUSTER AIR PLANE FACTORY. PUT OUR PLANE TOGETHER & CHECK THEM OUT FOR FLYING. ON DEC 4, 1944 WE FLEW THE ENGLISH CHANNEL. ARRIVED LIEGE ON DEC 10, 1944. ORDERED TO ST. VITH. ARRIVED DEC. 15, 1944 FLEW FIRST MISSION AM, DEC 17, 1944. LEFT AT ST. VITH TO WAIT FOR PILOT THAT WAS SENT ON A SUPPLY MISSION. LEFT ST. VITH AT 4:15PM, 12-17-44 FOR BEHOE, (WE HAD NO MAPS) I FLEW WEST & LANDED AT VIELSAHM. ASKED TO RECONNOITER AREA EAST OF VIELSAHM RAN INTO SMALL ARMS FIRE & NOTICED A TANK BATTLE GOING ON. (JOHN, AS YOU KNOW THE WEATHER WAS TERRIBLE & CEILING WAS 300 TO 500 FT)

I LANDED ON A STRIP ~~OUTSIDE~~ OF VIELSAHM NEAR THE TOWN OF MY. TWENTY CUBS HAD ASSEMBLED

ON THE STRIP, RANKING MAJOR DECIDED WE SHOULD FLY WEST, RAN INTO A FOG BANK & I TURNED NORTH WITH 6 OTHER PILOTS. IT WAS GETTING DARK & GAS WAS LOW SO I PICKED OUT A SPOT TO LAND. WHEN MY WHEELS TOUCHED I NOTICED A WIRE FENCE IN FRONT OF ME SO I GUNNED THE ENGINE, WENT THRU THE FENCE & BROKE MY PROPELLER, HOWEVER I DID MAKE A LANDING STRIP FOR THE OTHER PLANES. NOT KNOWING WHERE WE WERE WE WENT INTO TOWN & FOUND OUT THAT WE WERE IN THE TOWN OF NAMUR, BELGIUM. THE PICTURE THAT WAS PUBLISHED IN THE CLUB OF PILOTS & OBSERVERS WAS TAKEN NEXT DAY DEC 19, 1944. MY PLANE WAS REPAIRED & WAS ORDERED TO LIEGE, BELGIUM. I THEN RECEIVED ORDERS TO FLY TO WERBOMONT & REPORT TO MY BATTALION COMMANDER. (THE 592 FA STILL HAD ELEVEN 155 HOWITZERS & WERE ABLE TO OPERATE AS A UNIT) I REGISTERED FIRE ON THE ENEMY IN THE TOWNS OF WERBOMONT, ERIE, GORONNE, PETITTHIER, KREUTZ & HOLZHEIM. & OTHERS I DIDN'T KNOW.

IN APRIL 1945 AIR SECTIONS WERE ORDERED TO RENNES, FRANCE FOR REACTIVATING THE 106<sup>TH</sup> DIVISION. END OF APRIL UNIT FLEW TO BAD EMS GERMANY TO FLY MESSENGER

SERVICE TO THE VARIOUS P.O.W. CAMPS THAT  
WERE OPERATED BY THE 106<sup>TH</sup> DIVISION.

ON JUNE 16, 1945 I BROKE MY  
RIGHT LEG IN A REAR AIRPLANE ACCIDENT.  
AT FULDAGERMANY.

I FLEW OVER 35 MISSIONS & WAS  
AWARDED TO AIR MEDAL.

JOHN I HOPE THERE IS ENOUGH INFO  
FOR YOU TO WRITE A ARTICLE TO GO WITH THE PICTURE.

P.S. LT JOSTEN WAS TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER  
OUTFIT. S/Sgt GRAY WAS COMMISSIONED  
A 2<sup>ND</sup> LT & STAYED WITH DIVISION UNTIL  
THE END.

ALSO, MY ENGINE ICED UP ON ME TWICE I HAD TO  
DEADSTICK LAND IN THE SNOW. NOSE OVER  
BOTH TIME, FORTUNATELY THE PROPS ENDED  
IN THE RIGHT POSITION. WE DIDN'T HAVE  
AVIATION GAS. FILTERED TRUCK GAS.

The 106th Pilots tell how the Liaison Planes are used. Very prominent in a picture, centered in the page, is 1st Lt. C. W. Lauman, 592 FA, along with 2nd Lt. Josten and S/Sgt Jack Gray. Below that is a picture of Gray taking off in a CUB with a couple of barracks in the background.

It appears to be an interesting story.

This brings up a point. Could you prepare a story about your experiences in Belgium? It would make good reading. This newspaper is in such good shape that I could re-run the photo. Most of the old newspaper are brown and decaying, but this one was on a paper material of better quality and has held up.
